Name	Blue Morpho
Scientific Name	<i>Morpho peleides</i>
Threats (why they're at risk)	Cutting down trees and collection for their colourful wings
Distribution (where they live)	Latin America from Mexico to Columbia
Habitat (what they live in)	Tropical rainforest
Diet/Feeding strategy (what they eat and how they eat it)	When they are caterpillars they eat leaves. As butterflies they drink the juices of rotting fruit and dead animals
Social behaviour (how they live)	Adults tend to feed together
Males and females	Males are brighter than females
Lifespan (how long they live for)	115 days in the wild from egg to death
Number of young (how many babies)	They lay between 50-100 tiny green eggs
Interesting fact	The bottom of the wings is brown. They 'disappear' every time they close their wings, making them harder for predators to catch
