<b>Name</b>	Golden Mantella Frog
<b>Scientific Name</b>	<i>Mantella aurantiaca</i>
<b>Threats</b> (why they're at risk)	Cutting down trees for farming and building Distribution
<b>Distribution</b> (where they live)	A small area of forest in Madagascar
<b>Habitat</b> (what they live in)	Damp leaves by swamps in rainforests
<b>Diet/Feeding strategy</b> (what they eat and how they eat it)	They hunt for insects like termites and ants
<b>Social behaviour</b> (how they live)	They are a social species. They live in small groups called armies. They communicate by calling to each other with chirps or clicks
<b>Males and females</b>	Males are smaller than females
<b>Lifespan</b> (how long they live for)	8 years in the wild
<b>Number of young</b> (how many babies)	Between 12 and 30 eggs
<b>Interesting fact</b>	They have bright, colourful skin to warn predators that they're toxic to eat.
