<b>Name</b>	Jaguar
<b>Scientific Name</b>	<i>Panthera onca</i>
<b>Threats</b> (why they're at risk)	Cutting down trees and being hunted
<b>Distribution</b> (where they live)	Parts of North, Central and South America
<b>Habitat</b> (what they live in)	Rainforests, savannahs and swamp
<b>Diet/Feeding strategy</b> (what they eat and how they eat it)	They eat more than 80 different species of animals! They can hunt on the ground for mammals like tapirs, in trees for monkeys and in the water for turtles and fish
<b>Social behaviour</b> (how they live)	They mostly live alone and mark their territories with urine.
<b>Males and females</b>	Males are bigger than females
<b>Lifespan</b> (how long they live for)	up to 12 years in the wild
<b>Number of young</b> (how many babies)	usually 2 kittens every 2 years
<b>Interesting fact</b>	Black jaguars have the same markings as light jaguars, you just need to look closer to find them
