QUESTION 5

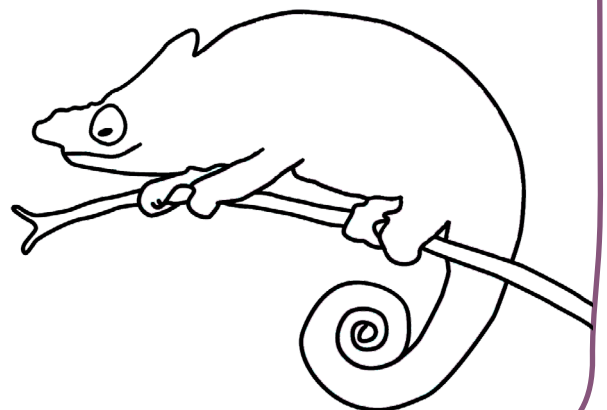
How long does it take for a Parson's chameleon's eggs to hatch?
