### COMPOST CONUNDRUM

#### What is composting?

Composting is a really good way of recycling and reducing waste, as well as making a great habitat for all sorts of wildlife near your home, at school or any green space.

Making good compost can be a bit tricky, so getting the balance just right between 'Browns' and 'Greens' is really important. Having a good mixture of woody material like small twigs or cardboard, along with leafy material like grass clippings and leaves in shallow layers is key. Make sure your compost doesn't dry out, catches the sun for part of the day and gets turned carefully every now and again to let oxygen in (be gentle, in case there's a sleeping hedgehog inside).


There're some things that shouldn't be put on your compost heap and should be recycled, or reused or disposed of in another way. Let's find out what these are!
