## NETWORKING SCAVENGER HUNT

Networking is something we should all be doing, but it's often unclear why, what the benefit will be, or even how to go about doing it. But there's a reason that networking comes up so frequently in career discussions - it works!



No matter what stage of your career you're in, whether you're looking for a new job or are happy in your current organisation, networking is an incredibly useful tool that can, and should, be practiced by just about everyone, especially in the world of conservation. This activity will help to introduce the concept of networking to students with a focus on developing self awareness (personal interests, qualities and strengths and interaction with others).


Structure: Whole group activity.

Duration: Variable.

Resources: Scavenger Hunt grid for each student.

Instructions: Ask the group to move around the room and work through the questions and record a signature on the grid if they find someone who corresponds with the statement.

Variations: Use a different set of questions based on your knowledge of the group. Have the group set the questions.
