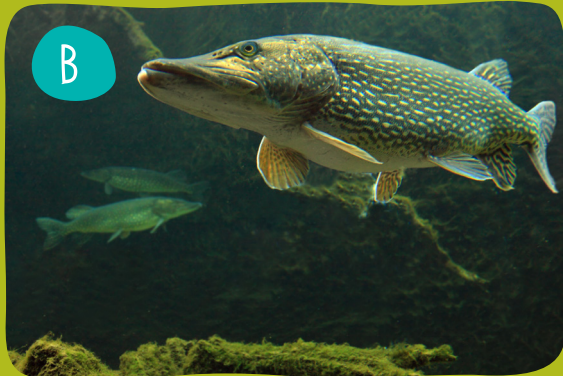


## FISH EYE-IDENTIFICATION
